### **Summer Break**

Finding a Quiet Place

"The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not



even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." (Mark 6:30-31, NIV)

What a lovely invitation from Jesus to go with him to a quiet place and get some rest! Sadly, so many of us are not very good at taking a break, of getting the rest our bodies and souls need – until we are forced to take that break.

The global pandemic has certainly enforced such a break for many of us, or at least slowed us down somewhat and narrowed our circle of gatherings. But with the end of the public health emergency in BC and many restrictions being lifted, what will we do? Will we revert to our pre-pandemic behaviours which created "human doings" rather than "human beings?" Or will we retain some of that slower, more careful pace where we notice the details of life around us? One person commented that, as she was looking for signs of hope and spring, she was noticing the small changes and seeing the beauty in her own backyard.

I am hoping and praying that we will not be like the disciples, who were too busy even to eat. I am hoping and praying that we will hear and accept Jesus' invitation to find a quiet place with him and to rest. After all, it is one of the commandments, that we take a sabbath rest – and that means a whole day, not just one hour for worship!

After my first sabbatical in 2009 where I read and participated in a retreat on Sabbath, I learned the importance and necessity of taking a day each week. Since Sunday is a busy time for me, I have set aside Mondays as my Sabbath. Now, as I age and my body dictates even more what I can and cannot do, I savour Sabbath as a day of rest. I encourage you to also find a day that works for you to take that chunk of time to rest, to spend time with Jesus in a quiet place. It is a necessary and healthy thing to do! As we read in Genesis, even God rested on the seventh day.

So where is your quiet place? My ideal is a warm, sunny beach, but I can't always go there. Most Mondays my quiet place is on my deck or in my living room, curled up in comfy clothes, reading, relaxing...drinking coffee©

This year, my summer break comes with six weeks of medical leave. Prayers have been answered as I await hip replacement surgery on July 26. I am grateful that my sister and her husband

will come to spend some time with me as I recover. I appreciate your prayers at this time.

As well, Mount Zion's COVID-19 Task Force recognized their own need to take a break, so this August we will be taking advantage of the many worship services offered online by other congregations.

May God bless us all with rest and re-creation this summer. And when we gather again in the fall, I look forward to hearing about your quiet place.

Council met once again by Zoom at the end of June. Here are some of the highlights:

The **Worship Team** continues to explore what worship will look like as the Public Health Orders relax and will reflect on what we have learned during this pandemic. The

Property Management Team presented various quotes to council to replace the flooring in the lower hall. A congregational meeting will be held on July 18, 2021 for further discussion. The **Sunday School Team** met in June via Zoom to brainstorm on how to engage our Sunday school children over the summer and into September. The team plans to send out a card to the children. They are also looking for a way to bring all the children together over the summer. The **Joy Team** is looking forward to a time when we can all celebrate baptisms, meet new members and attend other joyful events during the pandemic.

Council members attended two BC Synod Lay Leaders Meetings. The purpose of these meetings was to give everyone the heads up that effective July 1, 2021 all Public Health Orders regarding worship will be dropped, provided the number of people receiving vaccines goes up and the number of people testing positive for COVID-19 goes down. These Orders will be replaced by "Guidelines" for worship. During these meetings Bishop Greg's message was "Don't rush!" His suggestions were that we use the summer as a time for hope and healing, and a time to reflect upon what works for our own church and how we can be safe together.

Finally, please note that while council met monthly last summer during the pandemic, we are taking this summer off to rest and recharge.

Until then, please remember Pastor Marlys in your prayers as her hip surgery on July 26 nears. As well, reach out to those in need of a smile, a friendly voice or a helping hand.

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### **COVID-19 Task Force Update**

The COVID-19 Task Force met three times in June, twice by Zoom and once in person at the church to prepare for worship. Items on our agenda included reviewing Public Health Orders and deciding on inperson worship for Mount Zion, YoungNak and Creekside.

In consideration of Mount Zion, the Task Force made the decision to hold an in-person worship service on June 13, 2021. With much time and effort, and the collaborative work of eight people, we were able to return to Mount Zion and worship together as People of God for the first time since March 15, 2020. Our one and only service in the church this summer will be on July 18, 2021. Now we will wait and see what September brings.

With regard to both YoungNak and Creekside Churches, the Task Force agreed that both could start holding services inside the church provided they followed Public Health Orders.

For the time being, our working group will continue to meet as needed.


