Endings & Beginnings



We are nearing the end of another church year which is celebrated with Christ the King Sunday on November 20. Over the

years Mount Zion has observed Christ the King Sunday with a worship service that takes us on a journey through the whole church year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Season after Pentecost.



Through the church year we recall, proclaim and participate in the mystery of Christ's life, death and resurrection.

The following Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of a new church year. The season of Advent, the four weeks before Christmas, is a time of preparation for Christ's coming



to earth, first as a babe in Bethlehem and his second coming when Christ returns to judge the living and the dead. As in past years we will gather for a joint celebration with YoungNak Community Church, beginning with worship at **11:00am** followed by an amazing potluck lunch.

That Sunday, November 27, is also my final Sunday at Mount Zion. Following the month of December for holidays (and packing up my office[©]) I do not have any specific plans for my retirement which begins on January 1, 2023. So I begin a new church year with an ending - and a beginning into uncharted territory.

Endings and Beginnings...As we enter into this liminal space let us pray this prayer from the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* hymnal:

"O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Discerning the Way Forward

"Most congregations rely on rational decision making to guide their leadership choices. Liminal seasons invite us to shift out of rational decisionmaking mode and into a more discerning mindset. Discernment is an attentiveness to God that, over time, develops into a shared sense of God's intention for us and our community now." Rev. Susan Beaumont

Sometimes having structure as found in strategic planning and using the decision-making mode provides a sense of security. As Rev. Susan Beaumont points out in her book, *How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going,* we so badly want the structure that oftentimes we miss the opportunity to wait on what God might have in store for us, to see a different picture emerging. It is one of the hard parts of change, our need to feel in control and in doing so, fall back into old patterns when God might be calling us to be open, to think differently.

Journey. Together: Liminal Space is the BC Synod focus as many congregations find themselves in a new place in time. A place that can be scary at times, with the loss of how things were. At the same time, it can be a place of hope for what God might be calling us to be into God's future.

There is no doubt that after November 27 things will be different. Pastor Marlys will no longer be here to lead and guide us. However, we

trust, with God's guidance, all shall be well. It is interesting, too, that November 27 is the beginning of Advent...a time in the church season of waiting. Waiting for God's promises to unfold. So, once again, we will listen for God's Spirit in Word and through each other. And we will continue to try new things as we wait on God to see what emerges.

Twenty-one years ago we found ourselves in the same place. A place of transition. Back then we adopted a '**going not knowing'** philosophy. We came together during 'table talks' to determine who we were as God's people, and what God might be calling us to be. We did not know what we wanted other than knowing we wanted to move Mount Zion's ministry from 'Maintenance to Mission'. After many months of listening for God, and to each other, being open to whatever God had in store for us, thanks be to God, the Holy Spirit did the rest...And here we are today!

As we move, once again, into that **'going not knowing**' space, opportunities will be provided for all of us to share our thoughts and ideas about who we think God might be calling the people of Mount Zion to be into God's hopeful future.





So what's new with Community Connections? We met after our Honouring Memories Planting Dreams (HMPD) event to reflect on our learnings. What a wonderful, hopeful conversation that was for all of us on the team! Reflection is such a vital part of learning.

Honouring Memories Planting Dreams was a pretty big undertaking as an experiment. What we learned is how important giving ourselves adequate time was. We started our initial conversations on HMPD just prior to March 15 this year. That allowed us lots of time for planning which made such a big difference.

Aside from all the details, the exciting parts for us were the neighbourhood connections that were made. Our commitment to working with the Qayqayt First Nations people was vitally important to us. Having them participate was a gift. Now we look toward 2023 and the plans for the next 'annual' HMPD's event.

As part of our HMPD's reflections, we will share our learning on October 20 with the BC Synod Missions Committee over Zoom. These interviews are recorded to share the learning and to encourage others across the BC Synod to risk

God In Our Lives

I have been reflecting on how God is active in our lives (Bev and I), especially over these past almost 2 years since Bev's diagnosis of Lewy Body Disease. This is a neurodegenerative disease affecting many nerve functions in the mind and body and progressing relentlessly to dementia and demise.

A month after her diagnosis when she was sleeping 18-20 hours a day in a low bed which the twice-daily Fraser Health care aides complained bitterly about, I happened to meet a retired doctor couple on one of my Mundy Park walks who offered us an adjustable hospital bed to keep as long as we needed it. This felt to me like **God at work**, because we were not able to obtain one from the Red Cross at that point.

Bev has been bedridden for a year and 3/4, but our children's families come out at least every Saturday to cheer up Bev. The grand children often take turns climbing into bed with her and reading or playing games on their Switch platform beside her. This elates Bev and I feel **God is at work** here also.

The sons-in-law take turns cooking a wonderful dinner for us all each week. *God at work.*

Bev seemed to wake up after two nervous system medications were discontinued and is quite alert now, though forgetful often and terribly frustrated at being trapped in her bed. But still, having her be more aware and able to enjoy some girl friends' weekly visits and grandchildren's presence feels like **God at work** in our lives.

In March of this year a portable lift system and

a tilted-back wheelchair were provided by Fraser Health, so now I can get Bev up almost every day for an hour or more as tolerated without her fainting on us. **God at work** in our lives.

Our 2-year-old grandson Teddy watches Grammy get into the wheelchair by sling lift and he exclaims "Grammy flying".

We feel very blessed that Bev is able to remain at home and not in a facility. *God at work.*

We watch Mount Zion church services on YouTube every week and I Zoom the Reflections Bible Study session every Wednesday evening.

Lots of prayers, encouragement and support from people at Mount Zion have been strongly evident over the 43 years we have attended there, and these past two challenging years especially.

So how could we ever say that God has not been with us in our lives the whole way? God certainly has, and remains so faithfully.


