## Experiencing EASTER

**PASTOR'S PEN**  
*A word from the heart*

As we begin to emerge from the restrictions and isolation of the pandemic, are you feeling a bit like a butterfly emerging from its cocoon? If so, then you are well on your way to experiencing Easter!

Butterflies have long been a symbol for resurrection. Beginning as an egg which hatches into a caterpillar, there is no hint of the ultimate glorious reality of a butterfly. That lowly caterpillar eventually is entombed in a cocoon, portraying the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. How dark, dismal and dead it must be inside that cocoon. But that cocoon tomb is not the end for the butterfly. Rather it emerges in all its amazing glory and colour to soar in new life, a stunning image of resurrection. Alleluia! Christ is risen!



With the invasion of Ukraine, the ongoing violence, famine, and uncertainty for people in Ethiopia, Yemen, Eritrea, Sudan and other parts of the world, it certainly seems like much of the world is contained, even entombed in a cocoon where there is no freedom of movement, no light, no hope. In a world that seems more like Good Friday than Easter Sunday, we need to tell the whole story. Despite the sadness that may come to us from time to time; despite the way the world seems, the powers of evil and death have indeed been defeated. Christ IS risen.

Easter changed everything, and Easter continues to change everything. Remember that the Easter proclamation is not just "he is not here," but "he is risen." There is life in the midst of death, hope in the midst of despair, and love in the midst of hate. All because the risen Christ promises, "Lo, I am with you always." I am with you in the breaking of the bread, in the drinking of the wine at his supper, in the waters of baptism, in the gathering of his people, in the reading of the Word, in the midst of creation...



Christ IS risen. In our baptism we have been joined to his death and resurrection so we too can live in resurrection hope. We are called to proclaim this hope despite the circumstances in our lives which may suggest otherwise, which may leave us feeling as if we are stuck in a cocoon. Christ IS risen. Know that Easter is coming!

We will also continue to see how God will guide Sunday School in regards to our time together, our relationship to others in the congregation, and our community.

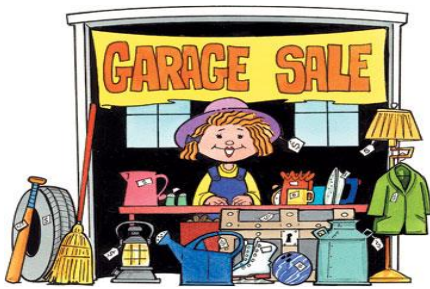

## COVID-19 Task Force Update

According to BC Public Health Orders (PHO), as of March 11, 2022 faith-based organizations are no longer required to limit capacity during worship nor are participants required to wear masks. As of April 8, 2022 proof of vaccine is no longer required to access non-essential events such as coffee time. Even though the PHO's allow for the lifting of the above restrictions, the COVID-19 Task Force is committed to moving slowly. Safety is paramount. The COVID-19 Task Force meets again at the end of April.

This is what you can expect:

- wearing of masks is RECOMMENDED
- physical distancing is REQUIRED until the end of April
- proof of vaccine no longer required to access events such as coffee time, effective April 8, 2022
- windows and doors will be opened for ventilation
- signs on doors will remain in place reminding people to stay at home if they have symptoms of COVID
- capacity limits for employee offices will remain in place (to be reviewed end of April)
- sign-in sheets will remain in place (to be reviewed end of April)
- renters given permission to decide on restrictions for their own group while adhering to existing PHO's

As promised in the Lenten newsletter we have more news for you about our next experiment. The BC Synod Missions Committee has approved the Honouring Memories Planting Dreams experiment. The Community Connections was incredibly pleased to get the news!

So, you might be asking, "What is this all about?"

Celebrated in May and June, Honouring Memories, Planting Dreams invites people of all ages to plant heart gardens in memory of children lost to the residential school system, to honour residential school survivors and their families, and to support the legacy of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). The act of planting represents our commitment to reconciliation. Hearts can be made by anyone of all ages and backgrounds.

June 21 is National Aboriginal Day. We recognize that truth and reconciliation are not a one-time event but an ongoing commitment to continuous learning and change. Many of us feel helpless in the face of so much that has happened to our Indigenous brothers and sisters. We wanted to offer the opportunity for people to learn more for themselves and the children in their lives. It provides a tangible way to acknowledge our part in what has gone before, and to show our support for the work of the TRC and all Indigenous people.

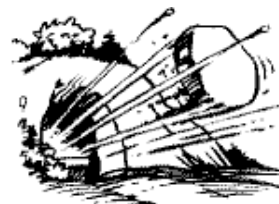

## Important Financial Information

Some highlights for February 2022:

- Donation (Envelopes) = 47% vs monthly budget
- Rental revenues = 89% vs monthly budget
- Expenses = 78% vs monthly budget
- Deficit = (\$5,125) which was higher than anticipated/budget deficit (\$3,175)
- Comparison with 2021: Jan to Feb 2022 deficit was \$1,299 higher than Jan to Feb 2021
