

Pentecost & Beyond

Joining God in the Neighbourhood

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8, NRSV)



(I first shared some of these words and images in 2015, but it seems so appropriate for us to hear them again, especially in the midst of COVID-19 when we feel so restricted and unable to do many of the things we enjoy. Some even wonder if God has abandoned us as this global pandemic drags on, now into the third wave. Yet in the midst of it all, despite all these circumstances God is at work! God's Spirit is alive and well, empowering us to be witnesses, to share our stories of what God is doing, even as we shelter in place.)

It must have seemed an impossible task when Jesus' disciples heard these sending words of Jesus. After all, few travelled very far from their home villages, let alone to the ends of the earth. Plus the group was so small and often scorned, so how could this happen? Yet, with only Christ's story and Christ's Spirit empowering them, a tiny community of believers changed the face of the world.

Two thousand years later we still hear stories of how the Holy Spirit is at work. Here at Mount Zion we have the marvelous pleasure of experiencing a microcosm of God's Spirit at work in the world as we hear the stories from people who have come from various parts of Europe, Africa, Asia, the Middle East, as well as North America. We have heard stories of how God continues to draw people despite circumstances where Christianity is illegal and/or persecuted. But perhaps it is more difficult to see how God

is at work in quiet, often unnoticed ways because they are part of our ordinary lives, things we often take for granted, like answered prayer, health, family, shelter, peace, etc.

Despite the pandemic and its accompanying restrictions we have seen how God has been at work, not just in our congregation and neighbourhoods but "to the ends of the earth" in cyberspace! Church council has been considering how we can continue to offer worship online even when we are able to gather in the building.

The promised gift of the Holy Spirit continues to empower us to be witnesses, wherever we are. We acknowledge that often our fears and reluctance inhibit us from being witnesses, but God is still at work! God is still at work – in us, in our neighbours, in our communities, and yes, in our congregation!

This summer I encourage you to look for ways God is at work already. Sometimes it may be as simple as noticing how seeds grow into plants! Share that wonder and joy with a family member or neighbour.

When I woke up at 5:30 this morning, I was pleasantly surprised at how light it was outside. I listened to the birds sing and thought, another sign of spring.

In our March newsletter I talked about the installation of this year's church council. Since then, council has elected the following officers: Bruce Cornish as Vice-Chairperson, Vivienne

Welters as Secretary, Paulos Nizghi as Treasurer and myself as Chairperson. On behalf of council, I would like to thank Doreen Fleury (our past secretary) and Len Imrie (our past treasurer) for their many years of service to Mount Zion.

Our council is now 14 members strong. Even though our church is still closed to in-person worship there is much to discuss during council meetings and many tasks to be done. This month we are updating our signing officers in accordance with Mount Zion Policy. Our Worship Team is discussing what worship might look like when we return to in-person worship. A special committee has been formed to explore the possibility of live-streaming our services. Two things to consider are the cost and identifying a dedicated team to film the services. The Property Management Team is kept busy with installing a sprinkler system on the from lawn at the Synod Office, responding to mold discovered in a Synod Office, testing for mold in our lower hall, flushing the water system to prevent it from going stagnant during this pandemic, repairing our heating system, meeting with lift inspectors, repairing the alarm system in the Synod Office and of course, gardening. The Parish Education Team is hearing positive feedback from the Easter packages that were mailed to children and the Joy Committee is joyfully anticipating the many things we want to celebrate when we return.

Just a few more items to share with you:

- 1. Our insurance increased again this year primarily because of the lift installation, upgrades to our kitchen and completion of a new insurance appraisal of our property. Because of this increase, a small task force has been created to assess if there are avenues to reduce the cost.
 - 2. We are updating our Criminal Record Checks and, finally,
 - 3. the COVID-19 Task Force continues to meet as needed.

I think this captures what council has been up to. Please remember Pastor Marlys and council in your prayers.





Book Nook Update!

Your Book Nook (Little Free Library) Team is underway. We have had some good conversation about ways to ensure the Book Nook space is inviting to our neighbours, both younger and older, who live and play around Mount Zion.

Little Free Libraries are a book sharing movement whose goal is to Build Community, Inspire Readers and Expand Book Access for All.

We know that our God is a God of surprises. We are open and look forward to learning about what God might be up to in the lives of our neighbours, as we step out in unfamiliar ways to experience this. Who knows what God might have in store for us?! One of the important aspects of experimenting with new things is not so much about the success or failure of what we do but, rather, how we are transformed.

We decided also to include a bench as we feel it invites conversation and a place to rest a bit while you go through books and make your choices. A bit closer to the church the walkway takes you to a quieter place. Should anyone want to pray, meditate, or just have some quiet time on one of the benches located there we will let them know about that too. It is a beautiful spot, one that our "garden gnomes" keep looking lovely.

This is all about offering space for our neighbours to enjoy. It is also about finding ways to connect, and possibly build relationships, with the people who live nearby.

We are hoping to have the library installed before the school term ends so everyone is aware of it and will come back repeatedly to check out what is available.

The premise is to *Take a Book, Leave a Book* (which the sign will say) so the neighbours fill it with their choices. Mount Zion will steward it to keep the bench and library looking good and to ensure a variety of books are offered.
