

Dear Heavenly Father,

You number our hairs and determine our days; you hang the stars and feed the sparrows; you open doors no one can shut and shut doors no one can open. Surely, we can trust you when the time comes for making big decisions, or for that matter, any decisions. We are in just such a season again, Father, and we know we are not alone. We will trust you for generous wisdom, straight paths and peaceful hearts, all for your glory.

How we praise you for being the decision-making-God. It's not our decisions, but yours that make all the difference. We will plan, but we trust you to order our steps. So, Father, make us more and more like Jesus, even as we trust you for the opening and closing of doors that are in front of us. All for your glory—in our eating and drinking; and in our whatever's, whenever's and wherever's. Amen.

My thanks to our delegates, Norma Houde and Pastor Marlys, and to all who helped in the planning and preparation of both of these events.

- d. To review and provide timely compensation recommendations to the congregational council/ board for rostered ministers and staff if there is no other personnel team in place.
- e. To work towards conflict resolution as it arises and involves the rostered minister or other staff members.


- \Rightarrow We will meet upstairs in the sanctuary.

- You are a close contact of a person who tested positive for COVID-19



British Columbia Synod Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada Convention Report

Journey. Together: Liminal Space October 21-24, 2021

We gathered together at 7:00p.m.on Thursday, Oct.21 in an online 200M meeting format and 87 registered delegates. We were led in prayer to give us eyes to see, ears to hear and hearts to know God's wishes.

Please go to the website www.bcsynod.org for the Complete Bulletin of Reports we discussed at convention as well as the names of the eight newly-elected Synod Council Members. Our Bishop's Report is 33 pages.

The B.C. Synod has elected Pastor Kathy Martin as Bishop. Pastor Kathy will assume the Office of Bishop as of January 1, 2022. Other elections included Chairperson: Pastor Eric Krushel and Secretary: Tarynn McKenzie with Jerry Nieman continuing as Treasurer. We will be well taken care of. We look forward to announcing the date for the bishop's ordination soon. Please keep Bishop-Elect Kathy, Bishop Greg, as well as the incoming and outgoing Synod Council members in your prayers.

Delegates had the opportunity during October to attend Training Sessions so we would know how to ZOOM to conduct the business of our Church. This included Bylaws and Amendments, Election of a Bishop, Electronic Voting, as well as the Proposed Budget and Financials Statements. (Thanks to Jerry Neiman.)

Our Opening of Convention on Thursday evening included a Tribute to the Tribes of B. C. This included Singers and Drummers from the Newhawk Tribe of Bella Coola as well as those from Kamloops.

Friday saw us in session for 12 hours.

Rev. Susan Beaumont joined us for the Synod Learning Day on Saturday, Oct. 23 from 10am-3pm to explore the experience of moving through a liminal season and clarifying the differences between decision making and discernment and how each of them can be used as we seek to understand the new things God wants us to learn.

A brief session took place on Sunday from 9 a.m. until our worship started at 10:30.

This was a very busy convention. Thanks and best wishes go with Bishop Greg. Welcome to Pastor Kathy and the new Synod Council. Congratulations to retiring Council Chairperson Stephen Holmes with heartfelt thanks.

Re: Notice of Annual General Meeting

As per Bylaw 7 (Congregational Meetings), Section 5:

Written notice of all congregational meetings shall be sent to all members and to the rostered minister(s) under call to the congregation at least fourteen (14) days in advance of the date of the meeting. Written notice must be sent:

- a. by mail, unless a member has provided his or her email address to the Congregational Council, in which case written notice must be sent by electronic mail;
- b. by posting the written notice on the congregational website; and
- c. by posting the written notice in a public area within the church building.

Please note the following ministerial order which applies to meetings governed by BC's *Societies Act*

Electronic attendance at corporate meetings

3 (1) Despite anything in a corporate enactment, a person who is entitled to participate in, including vote at, a corporate meeting may do so by telephone or other communications medium if all of the persons participating in the meeting, whether by telephone, by other communications medium or in person, are able to communicate with each other and, if applicable, vote at the meeting.
